Dion J. Pollard, professionally known as DionJa'Y, is a contemporary American visual artist whose Afrocentric narrative figurative work explores African diasporic heritage, cultural identity, music, ancestry, spirituality, and memory. Working across painting, mixed media, relief, and sculpture, he combines figurative realism, expressive elongation, layered texture, symbolic abstraction, and African visual motifs. His work honors Black cultural experience while connecting ancestral memory with contemporary life.

ARTIST STATEMENT

My work is rooted in storytelling. Through painting and sculptural mixed media, I explore the cultural threads that connect the past, present, and future within the African diaspora. I draw from ancestral symbolism, music, spirituality, family, and everyday moments that carry deeper meaning within Black culture.

My works are visual narratives of resilience, celebration, reflection, and memory. African motifs, expressive color, layered surfaces, and dimensional materials allow me to build histories into the physical body of each piece. Each work invites a conversation between personal experience and collective memory while honoring cultural heritage and identity.
